Call to Order: A non-public meeting of the DAC was held at the Annie C. Merts Center on Tuesday, August 22, 2017. Chairperson Keith Poe called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m.

Members discussed holding the district meetings at elementary schools this year instead of high schools. They also discussed the best ways to spread the word about the public meetings, what we do, and the DAC email address and website. Members brought up

rebranding and utilizing other means of marketing and Keith said we could possibly utilize the PR firm provided by HCS. Students recommended more effective ways to reach high school students and their teachers, including peer meetings and social media
